

Meet ISH-DC Resident Jose Flores, Honduras

"I arrived in Washington for the first time last January. It was so cold. We don't have that kind of cold in Honduras. On my second day here, it snowed. I had never seen snow before. Then, fellow residents introduced me to snowball fights." Jose Flores, a resident scholar at ISH-DC from Honduras, laughs.

Washington was a last minute decision for Jose. "Completing an internship is part of my degree program. Originally, I was supposed to intern at Disney World, but at the last minute, the Organization of American States called. I switched, and I believe I made the right decision."

He enjoys living at ISH-DC. "The people make the House. I have met some wonderful people and made incredible friends. We are planning a trip to Latin America next year. At the Garden Party organized by the House, I met Congressman Mark Meadows. He offered to arrange a tour of the White House for us. At first, my friends and I thought he was just being polite. But, then he personally gave us a tour of the White House and took pictures of us outside."

Meeting new people is just one way ISH-DC has changed Jose's life. "Living at the House has changed me. I'm told that I speak differently. Maybe I've grown up a little bit. The House has helped define what I want to do in life. I was planning to get a Masters degree in business, but now, after living at the House, I'm debating about going into public administration instead. Right now, public administration is winning my internal debate."
